

Summary of Comments Received

Flip Chart Comments

- Add tonight's presentation to the webpage
- Bury utility poles/lines
- Poles are located in the middle of the sidewalk (2 locations)
- Trees
- Move poles to back of sidewalk
- Low water plants
- New modern poles like in Nob Hill
- Narrow medians intermittently for landscaping
- Medians are obstructions
- If you block on-street parking now, you may not be able to transition back to it in the future
- Longer bus pull-outs
- Park benches, furniture, street lighting on both sides of street, reflective street signs, trash baskets with wide enough sidewalk to accommodate
- Feel comfortable/safe resting on the sidewalk
- Intermittent landscaping would suffice for a buffer
- Prefer trees over bushes
- Find out what type of trees work in different circumstances
- What opportunities to improve the corridor exist today?
- Median with landscaping would make the "gateway" to Downtown more inviting
- Traffic study to determine the number of cars turning left
- Identify driveways that need fixing

Option 1

Likes

- Allow parking on both sides of road
- Continuous on-street parking

Dislikes

- Same typical
- Not enough of an improvement
- Less opportunity for landscaping

Option 2

Likes

- Limit on-street parking to businesses that need them

Dislikes

- No need to sacrifice parking for a narrow median

Option 3

Likes

- Parking on both sides south of RR
- Median north where trees can be planted
- Parking for future consideration

Dislikes

- Buffer needed in median section
- Cost of trees and maintenance

Option 1

Likes

- Looks to future for parking

Dislikes

- Not different enough from existing
- Not much improvement
- Less opportunity for landscaping

Option 2

- Is loss of parking worth it for a 6' median?
- Keep the wider median from Haines Avenue to I-40
- Intermediate medians as parking/street/traffic permit
- Preserve on-street parking for the future

Option 3

- Intermittent landscaping
- Gateway for Downtown
- Islands of trees
- Look for opportunities for trees
- Save existing trees
- Start up project – opportunity for small project for landscaping/street furniture
- Street benches (1-2 per block and away from traffic)
- Waste cans
- Reflective signs
- Street lighting for safety
- Identify driveway aprons that need fixing
- Identify sidewalk options for fixing “now”

Likes

- Parking on both sides of the street; future consideration
- Transition could be used for trees
- 12' median can be a gateway
